

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
JUNE 25, 1990

In accordance with the Warrant, as posted, the inhabitants of the Town of Wilbraham, qualified to vote in Town affairs, met in Minnechaug Regional High School. Town Moderator Donald F. Bready called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m. when it was determined that a quorum was present and the call of the meeting was read by Town Clerk Mary A. Irla.

Tellers appointed and sworn in by the Moderator were: Robert Glidden, Mary E. Hadley, Gloria Jurkowski.

ARTICLE 1: Voted by a Majority (6 Against) that the Town adopt the following By-Law relating to mandatory recycling:

"All residents of the Town shall be required to separate their solid waste into various categories for the purpose of recycling in the manner set forth by any rules or regulations promulgated by the Board of Health."

ARTICLE 2: Voted Unanimously to TAKE NO ACTION.
(To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Section 22D of Chapter 32)

ARTICLE 3: Voted Unanimously (Yes 90 - No 0) that the Town amend the Zoning By-Law in a comprehensive manner, conditional upon approval by the Attorney General, by fully deleting the existing Zoning By-Law in its entirety and substituting therefor a reorganized, recodified, and revised version of the By-Law entitled "Zoning By-Law of the Town of Wilbraham, 1990 Revision", in the form recommended by the Planning Board and on file with the Town Clerk, and amended as follows:

(1) Delete the code reference "ZBA" listed in the GB District under Section 3.4.6.1.B, and substitute therefor the reference "N";

(2) Amend Section 5.5.2 to read "No building shall exceed two (2) stories in height above the ground."

ARTICLE 4: Voted Unanimously that the Town vote to transfer the sum of \$709.29 from previously appropriated but unexpended funds in the FY 1990 Budget 101, Police Salaries, to FY 1990 Budget 101, Police Expenses.
