

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
JUNE 22, 1992

ATTENDANCE:

In accordance with the Warrant, as posted, the inhabitants of the Town of Wilbraham, qualified to vote in Town affairs, met in Minnechaug Regional High School. At 7:15 p.m. Town Moderator Arthur F. Dionne noted a quorum was present and the call of the meeting was read by Town Clerk Mary A. Irla.

ARTICLE 1: Funding Transfer: Finance Committee Recommends.

Voted by a Majority that pursuant to Section 33B of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, the Town transfer the sum of:

\$6,087 from previously appropriated but unexpended funds in the FY 1992 Budgets 003, Selectmen's Expenses (\$1,587), 017, Registrar Salaries (\$2,000), and 029, Assessor Expenses (\$2,500) to Budget 045, Legal Expenses;

\$2000 from previously appropriated but unexpended funds in the FY 1992 Budget 003, Selectmen's Expenses, to FY 1992 Budget 003, Selectmen's Salaries; and

\$6,000 from previously appropriated but unexpended funds in the FY 1992 Budget 101, Police Salaries, to FY 1992 Budget 101, Police Expenses.

ARTICLE 2: Authorization to Borrow for Capital Outlays: Finance Committee Recommends. Voted by a more than 2/3 Majority (Yes 225, No 5) that the Town appropriate \$283,000 for remodeling, reconstructing or making extraordinary repairs to public buildings owned by the Town; and to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Board of Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$283,000 under Section 7 (3A) of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

ARTICLE 3: Authorization to Borrow for Capital Outlays: Finance Committee Recommends. Voted by a more than 2/3 Majority (Yes 277, No 8) that the Town appropriate \$50,000 for the purpose of removing asbestos from municipally owned buildings; and to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Board of Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$50,000 under Section 7 (31) of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

ARTICLE 4: Reallocation of Bond Issue Appropriations: Finance Committee Recommends. Voted by a more than 2/3 Majority (Yes 281, No 6) that the Town authorize the Board of Selectmen to expend from already appropriated, yet unexpended funds, the sum of \$51,784.58 from the West Colonial Sewer Bond Issue, for the purpose of making repairs and improvements to the Dudley Street Pumping Station, pursuant to Section 20 of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

ARTICLE 5: Fee for Underground Storage Tank Removal: Voted by a Majority (2 opposed) that the Town add Section 623 to Article 6 of the Town By-Laws to establish a fee for removal or relocation of underground flammable or combustible fluid tanks at \$75.00 per tank for tanks with a capacity between 550 and 10,000 gallons, as provided in Section 38(A) of Chapter 148 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

ARTICLE 6: Game Farm Agreement: Voted Unanimously that the Town vote to authorize an agreement with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on the use of the Wilbraham Game Farm property as a wild life area and for Town purposes in accordance with Section 4D of Chapter 40 of the Massachusetts General Laws, with the use of said property being made available to the Town for no monetary consideration.

Motion to dissolve the meeting passed Unanimously at 8:30 p.m.
