RE: MILLER STREET WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT PROJECT – PHASE 1

The Town of Wilbraham is in the process of designing the replacement of a water main on Miller Street in Ludlow. The purpose of the project is to replace an existing deteriorated cast iron water main that was installed prior to the 1950s with a new water main. Phase 1 of the water main replacement project extends from Wilbraham’s Corrosion Control Facility (across from 555 Miller Street) southerly to approximately 413 Miller Street, and is expected to be constructed in 2026. Phase 2 of the water main replacement project, from approximately 413 Miller Street to 283 Miller Street, will be completed as part of a future project. Refer to the 90% DRAFT design drawings for more information.

Construction is expected to begin in June 2026 and last through the summer. The water main trench will be paved regularly during construction. Traffic management such as signage, police details, and detours (if required) will be in place during construction.

For Ludlow water customers that are serviced by Wilbraham on Miller Street, water service will continue throughout construction with occasional shutdowns. As homes are connected to the new water pipe in 2026, a short shutdown will be required. Residents will be notified by the Contractor prior to planned shutdown.

Through this project, the Town of Wilbraham aims to continue providing a safe and reliable drinking water supply for Ludlow residents along Miller Street and the customers within the Town of Wilbraham.
